

Eucharistic Miracle Stories from Corpus Christi Parishioners

The Catholic Church teaches that Jesus is truly present — body, blood, soul, and divinity — in the Eucharist. We are blessed to have the opportunity to receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament every day at Mass, and at our parish, we have access to Jesus in the Adoration Chapel 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Because the Host is not merely a piece of bread, but Jesus himself in the flesh, the Eucharist has the same ability to heal and perform miracles in our lives as the stories we read of lesus performing miracles in the gospels. Our parish has hosted Eucharistic miracle exhibits featuring well-documented miracles from around the world. However, there are countless healings and miracles that regular Catholics experience every day. Several weeks ago, there was an announcement in the bulletin asking parishioners to send me their personal Eucharistic miracle stories to share. Here are just a few that were shared.

A Recovery from Illness

"I have had a close relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist for about ten years. However, since committing to a regular weekly holy hour in the adoration chapel in 2023 and 2024, my bond with Jesus has increased. After going to dinner with friends the night before, I felt ill on December 20, 2023, and went to see a doctor. The doctor sent me home without treatment, telling me I would be fine by the weekend. Since I live alone, I asked a friend to stay the

night one night and my cousin to stay over the next night. On the day my cousin was with me, I went into cardiac arrest due to extreme dehydration caused by the illness. Because my cousin was there, the paramedics were called and life-saving measures were taken. I awoke in the hospital on Christmas Eve after being in ICU and intubated for three days. I am certain it was Jesus guiding the events during those days, and if he had not been, my physical life would have ended that day. I am still suffering from the effects of the incidents, but through Jesus, I am continuing to heal."

An Injury Healed

"Several years ago, I dislocated my shoulder and tore the ulnar nerve in my left arm. I had surgery to repair the nerve, but the surgeon said there would be no guarantee the surgery would be successful. I continued to have extreme nerve pain from my elbow down to my hand. One Sunday, while at Mass, the pain was excruciating, and I had no feeling in my hand. It was time for Communion, and I heard a sort of voice in my head telling me that Jesus would help me. When I took the Host, before consuming it, I touched it to my nerve-damaged hand and then headed back to my seat. Before reaching my pew, the pain in my arm was gone, and I had full feeling in my hand. To this day, there have been no further problems and my doctors were amazed."

A Marriage Saved

This is a story of how the Eucharist healed a marriage. Originally shared by the wife, first is her perspective.

"Several years ago, my husband had an affair, which devastated me. The first six months or so after the discovery of the affair were quite tumultuous, but we continued attending Mass. It was sometime around the sixth month I was resolved to divorce and seek an annulment, thinking that reconciliation and healing would be impossible, something inside of me told me to wait. In the beginning and repeatedly for many, many months, I visited the Adoration Chapel, prostrating myself before the Blessed Sacrament in tears because I believed lesus was the only person who could understand the depth of the pain the betrayal had caused me, as Jesus himself knew the suffering that came from betrayal. Jesus stayed close to me and enabled me to see my husband's contrition conversion and through my grief. It was difficult, but slowly but surely, forgiveness, reconciliation, and healing did happen. It's not perfect and there are still moments of pain, but overall, I would say that our marriage is stronger than ever, and that would not have been possible if it had not been for the healing grace that comes from the Eucharist."

The husband also shared his perspective: "Coming to terms with the gravity of what I had done, I found that the Adoration Chapel was a place of solace and reflection. It was quiet, unlike the yelling voices in my head accusing me of all the awful things I had done. I was made very aware that I was, essentially, a prodigal son in that moment, and that story came to mind guite often as I sat in front of the Eucharist. Psalms 51, 32, and 130 appeared to come from nowhere, but were placed in front of me frequently in the Chapel and I heard them suddenly everywhere. "...With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption" as the Psalmist says. These words struck home as I wrestled with the sins I had committed and the impact they were having on my wife and family. Reflecting on God's love and mercy gave me hope that I, too, could be made whole again, and that our marriage and family could recover through God's grace. These thoughts and calming words were extremely helpful in reorienting my life and my attention to Christ and I know that the hours spent in front of the Blessed Eucharist were instrumental to reclaiming my life for the better."

A Heart Consoled

"I would like to share my experience of Eucharistic healing. It's not a physical healing, but rather, an emotional and spiritual one. My father passed away in June of this year [2024]. Knowing that the souls in both Purgatory and Heaven are present with us at every Mass has been a great

comfort to me, especially in the weeks immediately following my dad's death. About a month later, I attended the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. The entire week was absolutely incredible; words fail to capture the experience of being among tens of thousands of others worshiping our Eucharistic Lord. It was so powerful, that at times during Mass and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, I could feel the veil between Heaven and Earth being pierced. One of the speakers that week was Mother Olga of the Sacred Heart. She shared about some of her own Eucharistic encounters and healings she had seen with the people she serves. She's known for saying, "See you in Eucharist," rather the than "Goodbye," and it was yet another reminder for me that, although I can no longer see my dad on this side of Heaven, I know he is with me when I'm in the presence of Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. At Mass and in Adoration, when I gaze up at the Host that is the Body of Our Lord Jesus, lifted up just as He was on the cross, the veil is pierced again. The wall fades away and instead, I can see my dad and the communion of saints and angels worshiping and adoring along with me."



The grand and spectacular miracles showcased in the exhibits are wonderful to learn about. Still, the reality is that there are beautiful and wondrous miracles happening in the lives of the people in the pews around you because of their devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist. Hopefully, these stories have inspired you to increase your own devotion to the Eucharist. If you already have such a devotion, please share your stories with others to encourage them. If you have not already, consider committing to a weekly holy hour and watch the many miracles and blessings that will come about in your life as a result.

If you have a personal Eucharistic miracle to share with me like these stories, please do! If I can collect enough of them, I will do another piece like this to bring even more awareness to the potential of what's possible with the awesome power of the Eucharist in our lives. DECEMBER 9 IS A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION!!!

In 2024, December 8 is the Second Sunday of Advent, so the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, Dec. 9. **Previously**, in the US, when the DATE was transferred the obligation was abrogated. **That will no longer be true.** Upon receiving clarification from the Holy See regarding this matter, it was determined that "the feast must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred." **In light of this new directive**, **the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday**, **December 9**, 2024 is **to be observed as a Holy Day of Obligation**.




