- 3. Opening Prayer (Lenny)
 - a. Opening prayer should address some aspect of God and creation.
 - b. Order of Creation
 - i. Day one: Light;
 - 1. **Day one:** Light
 - a. Even though the Sun and Moon are not created until Day four.
 - The author is interested in an ordered creation not a scientific creation story.
 - c. God names day and night, claiming authority over them(what one names one has authority over—we will see this when Adam names the animals).
 - ii. **Day two:** Sky, separating the upper and lower waters;

1. **Day two:** Sky

- a. Separates the Water above from below.
- b. The region this story originated was surrounded by water. The author/editors were constantly in fear of floods. The believed that only heaven kept the waters from pouring down or flooding over the banks.

iii. Day three: Earth and vegetation;

- 1. **Day three:** Earth and Vegetation
 - a. God put a limit on the expanse of water
 - b. Called forth vegetation
 - c. Vegetation has the power to reproduce itself (with it seed in it (11)).
 - d. Important to show that God is control and not pagan deities

iv. Day Four: Heavenly lights;

- 1. **Day four:** Heavenly lights
 - a. Creates the lights and places them in the heavens.
 - b. Does not call the "Sun" and "Moon" Sun and Moon, rather
 lesser light and greater light
 - c. The Sun and Moon were considered deities and the author
 is showing that their is only one God and all the lights were
 His creation.

- a. **Day five:** The waters that separated from above and below were filled with:

- vi. **Day six:** Land animals and humanity.
 - 1. Day six: The creation of animals and humanity
 - a. The entire creation story has lead to humans ability to live on the Earth
 - b. Time has been developed to govern our lives
 - c. Man and Women is created
 - d. The high point of all creation
 - e. Created in the image and likeness of God (26).
 - f. Who is last in the procession leads the prayer!
 - g. You can see this in our Mass.
- vii. Day seven: Rested (Sabbath)
- 4. Conclusion
 - a. Priestly account of creation is the logical account
 - b. God is a power being able to create by speaking a word
 - c. God transcends creation
 - d. Humanity is the high point of creation
 - e. The world has been organized by God so humanity can live here
 - f. Humanity is to be sovereign over the world as God's representative
